-: Beneath those garlands :-




My dear student friend,

Did you know that there is a peculiar variety of bamboo in China that spends several years towards spreading and strengthening its roots. During this period, the external growth is shockingly dismal. But once it is done with the above phase, the bamboo would grow at an astonishingly fast pace!

I can't say with confidence that I spread and strengthened my roots, but I can promise you that my growth was absolutely dismal in the first 20 years of my life. I was a mediocre student who remained invisible to most teachers thanks to my indifference and lack of participation in both academic and extra-curricular activities. If there was one thing I did with amazing consistency, it was dreaming. I dreamt mighty dreams—I dreamt during the night and even during the day—so much that my 7th standard progress report carried the remark, “He day-dreams in class!” I dreamt of ascending mighty stages amidst the applause of thousands.

With my current knowledge in Psychology, I understand that I was using day-dreaming as my coping mechanism for my inferiority complex. I studied in an international school where 90% of the students were richer and better looking than me. This inferiority complex led to low scores and a weak personality. My dream world was the only place where I could feel strong and powerful. Dreams were my way of escaping reality. I had absolutely no clue about what career I wanted to pursue or who I wanted to become. I chose the commerce group solely out of disdain for the science subjects and Chartered Accountancy happened as a natural consequence.

I listen with amusement when students tell me that they were toppers in school but have now lost interest in studies— because I developed interest in studies only after plunging into CA. While the subjects didn't fascinate me much, the sheer act of working hard raised my self-esteem significantly. But despite working hard, I failed in my CA Final exams thrice, solely because my basic understanding of subjects was very weak. I sat all alone in my room staring at my results thinking, “Maybe this is how far my limited intellect and knowledge can get me.”



I told my father, “Maybe I don’t have it in me to become a CA. Maybe I’m not intelligent enough.” My father sat me down and said, “Shandip, the day you were born, I held you in my arms and hummed that song of MGR: ‘When you walk amidst mighty gatherings, people should adorn you with garlands; and they should sing praises that here comes a king who lacks nothing!’ I know that it will certainly happen. But for that to happen, you have to stop being a coward. Get back up and fight.” A tear rolled down my cheek. He wiped my tear, squeezed my shoulders, and roared, “Strengthen these shoulders so that they can bear the weight of those garlands.”


With my father’s confidence as my spear, and my mother’s love as my armour, I fought fiercely like never before, and there was no looking back. When I qualified CA in May 2014, I genuinely believed that all my struggles were over and I’d live happily ever after. Little did I know that all my struggles until then were only a practice session for the battles to come!

Life tossed me from one battlefield to another—each one fiercer, scarier, and more damaging than the ones before. Each battle left me with countless scars; scars I have to carry for the rest of my life. On all those lonely nights amidst the countless dastardly battles, I’d lie down under the star studded sky humming “When you walk amidst mighty gatherings, people should adorn you with garlands; and they should sing praises that here comes a king who lacks nothing!”

I cried on most of those nights, but I got up even before my tears dried—because I had battles to fight, stages to conquer, and garlands to earn. Above all, I had to strengthen my shoulders to bear the weight of those garlands. Eventually I became so comfortable with fighting, falling, and bleeding in battlefields—that I even threw myself into the battles of my loved ones.

In the last ten years, I’ve fought more battles than you can ever imagine—some on the outside and many on the inside, some for me and many for those around me. But even amidst the din and clutter of these battles, never did I lose sight of my father’s dream! Despite the many battles, I earned a Masters in Psychology and a specialisation in Positive Psychology, mentored over a hundred CA students, held various prestigious positions, and addressed over a lakh people.

In 2023, I climbed that mighty stage in my alma mater Good Shepherd International School, Ooty—the very place where I was day-dreaming about ascending mighty stages. The mediocre student with inferiority complex who sat day-dreaming in his class lived his dream of delivering a Ted-X talk and even earned a standing ovation for it.



And in 2025, I climbed another mighty stage amidst a packed auditorium to launch my book "Wide Awake." My mother sat in the first row beaming with pride and beside her was my father with tears-filled eyes. The Chief Guest and the Guest of Honour lavished praise upon me, and a few highly respected Past Chairmen of the Coimbatore Branch of ICAI garlanded me. As I looked at my father from the stage, a tear rolled down my father's cheeks. Our hearts hummed in sync, "When you walk amidst mighty gatherings, people should adorn you with garlands; and they should sing praises that here comes a king who lacks nothing!" He knew his son had arrived. He knew that his son's shoulders were now strong enough to carry those garlands of victory.
